

LOCAL NAMES FOR ROADS/JUNCTIONS IN THE VILLAGE.

1. **WEARE GIFFARD CROSS.** Junction of Weare Giffard Road with A386 at Annery Kiln.
2. **THE CROSS.** Junction of main village road with Halspill turn off at Halfpenny Bridge.
3. **COOPERS HILL.** Also called The Hill. From Summerplace to Dock Cottages. It is said a family called Cooper lived here and used the local withy (willow) beds for making baskets.
4. **ROCKY LANE.** From The Barton to Church View - and in earlier times through to Netherdown.
5. **RECTORY HILL.** From Quay Cottage, past the Church to the Old Rectory.
6. **COPSE LANE/ROAD.** From Corner Cottage to the top of Stoney Lane.
7. **PARK HILL.** From Corner Cottage to Park Farm.
8. **PARKHOUSE HILL.** From Corner Cottage, past Ford View to Stoney Bridge (Stoney Bridge once crossed the Mill leat at meadow to this point taking the road across the the Fording).
9. **STONEY LANE.** From Bridge View at Chopes Bridge, up the hill to the far end of Copse Lane/Road. (Once called 'Bryants Hill').
10. **KEEPERS LANE.** From New Buildings Chopes Bridge, (along what is sometimes called Millionaires Row as at least three Bank managers once lived there), and through into the Clinton Estates Woods to Southcote Bungalow. The lane is thought to be named after either keeper Charles Edworthy or Mr. Hunt.
11. **CHOPES BRIDGE.** Almost certainly after a family called "Jopes".
